## **NJPHA Awards**

### **Dennis J. Sullivan Award**

The New Jersey Public Health Association's highest award. Established in 1976 and named after Dennis J. Sullivan, a health officer who dedicated his life to improving the public health of New Jersey.

Presented to an individual in recognition of a distinguished career of dedicated and outstanding public service and contributions to the cause of public health in New Jersey.

### **Dr. Ezra Mundy Hunt Award**

Established in 1995 and named after Dr. Ezra Mundy Hunt, one of the pioneers of public health in New Jersey. Dr. Hunt, a physician practicing in Metuchen during the mid-19<sup>th</sup> Century, was an advocate for the creation of public health departments at the state and local level, and was the first Secretary of the New Jersey Board of Health. He also one of the founders of both NJPHA and the American Public Health Association.

Presented to an individual or organization for an outstanding contribution to the cause of public health in New Jersey through advocacy, leadership, service and/or research.

### **Lloyd M. Felmly Award**

Established in 1976 and named after Lloyd M. Felmly, Editor of the Newark Evening News and a long-time friend of public health.

Presented to an individual for outstanding contributions through the communications media to the cause of public health in New Jersey.

### **Dr. Ronald Altman Student/Resident Award**

Established in 1995 and named after Dr. Ronald Altman, an expert in communicable and chronic diseases, whose long service at the New Jersey Department of Health included serving as the New Jersey State Epidemiologist, founding the Cancer Registry, and as the founding Medical Director of the HIV/AIDS Program.

Presented to an individual for outstanding work in a health-related course of study, including outstanding research.
